

## MASTER OF EDUCATION IN EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP AND ADMINISTRATION

COHORT: Physical and Health Education July, 2016 – July, 2018

The StFX Faculty of Education is proposing to offer a Canada-wide Master of Education (Educational Leadership and Administration) cohort with a focus in Physical and Health Education for qualified in-service teachers and administrators beginning in the summer of 2016. This cohort is meant to enable students to develop their leadership abilities and capacities within school communities, especially as they relate to physical and health education. Moreover, this cohort is also meant to support students so that they may develop research competencies and literacy within these same areas.

Graduate students will be required to attend a residential program on campus during the month of July, 2016 to complete the first two courses. This face-to-face (F2F) residency has proven to be a very successful part of the cohort experience, allowing for the development of a community of learners. All subsequent courses will be offered online (OL) via a synchronous learning platform (Collaborate). \* To accommodate students from across the country, all online courses will be held from 7:00 pm – 10:00 pm (Atlantic Time). All students may also elect to participate in an international service-learning (SL) course in Belize in July, 2017.
